1. Welcome – Kathryn Chevalier,
2. Approve minutes from last meeting- Kathryn Chevalier. Amanda motioned to approve Dillon seconded it. Google docs if you want to review the minutes from last minutes.
3. Silver Rush Report- Student Government, Dallin carter and SBO finance (couldn't hear his name). Bear O Care was the chosen foundation, it felt right. Not sure how it was going to work out and a lot of miscommunication and not knowing what was going to happen in the world around us. Once we got the green light and support, they worked hard to come up with different activities. The biggest activity was the telethon. We had a lot of interaction on Instagram. Very successful and we hope it starts a new tradition that we can build upon in future years. We did little activities throughout the day. Very successful in penny wars, grateful for those who worked towards them. Lunch room activities and passed out flyers, made sure masks and social distancing was adhered to. We earned \$97,000, loved all the great support and ability to have silverrush with all the darkness around us, it was nice to have. Talking about SilverRush part 2. Not sure if we will be able to do it, hoping for Mr. SilverRush etc... Haven't made an official statement. Carolyn said so much was dependent. What is Bear O Care? Local organization who help adults with multiple disabilities, they help them continue experiences. They were use to being picked up on a bus regularly for school, then it all just stopped until Bear O Care took over as an option for adults with disabilities.

5. Registration for 2021/2022 – Carolyn Gough, We are trying to base our course schedule off of student requests. Has some pros to allow teachers to offer classes they may not normally offer. Gives us the opportunity to possibly have a more accurate student number. We are trying to build a schedule so the student can get that class. Trying to make it so students and parents don't feel so freaked out to get the class they want. You are not picking actual class period or teacher. But you can still make changes during a window. Trying to put a schedule together that meets most of the needs. All of this was happening last year just as we were moving into dismissal. Carolyn was very pleased that most people were happy with the schedules that they got. We felt like it was successful, but were dealing with 100 other things. Know all of your dates and deadlines, sophomore orientation, test dates, etc.....

Sophomore orientation format will be different, it will be all virtual. We will be going to middle school for freshman. We have been trying to build in a canvas course with information. Feb 26, JATC applications are due, must apply for JATC. Auditions will be held and have deadlines in March. April 30 schedules and master schedules will be released to students. Counselors are visiting History classes Feb 22-25 to make your requests for next year, this is the place where we will be getting the information to formulate schedules. Changes can be made May 5th. Schedules do close to avoid having some students go in and just drop classes that often they need. Recognize that individual changes may still need to be made. A big change from the district is offering virtual class options. Jordan district is offering a virtual high school with their own administrators. Not sure how that information will be presented. Feb 10th we will start advertising. Hybrid is also an option. We are undertaking blended learning but will be re-defined. Scariest part of virtual learning is kids just disappear. Blended learning offers flexibility with a strong tie to the school.

How are you keeping them more connected? Expectations to know the kids, there will be a period of time where instructors will be doing face to face instructions getting to know needs. Learning how to make it even better than it already is. Not sure what other high schools are doing. Not a chance to sleep in. We are here then gradual release to virtual when ready.

Kathryn: What is feedback about 4 day work week.

Angie: Some people think teachers aren't working on Fridays. But teachers feel like they work more on Friday. The kids that are coming in are benefiting greatly from it. Needs communication and campaign, set up the parameters again. Fridays have completely changed the way that education is. Definitely good work going on, but need better parameters because its hard for teachers to leave on-time. Teachers are available 10-2:30 pm. Prior to 10 there are teacher/faculty meetings. Response intervention time, lots of conversations about productivity, The Friday schedule has delivered a great opportunity to fill the Response intervention need. How many students take advantage of it? Interesting to see, Friday's start slow at the beginning of the quarter then they "just go". Fridays are a busy day for the school. Amazing that so many students are taking advantage of it. We don't know what next year will look like.

Amanda Bollinger, her student feels a lot less stress, grateful for Fridays especially with sports.

Amanda has done a lot of research on a 4 day week and fully supports it.

6. COVID Update

If a student in classroom tests positive, if everyone was wearing a mask, nobody needs to quarantine. Mask to mask exposure you don't need to quarantine, which is huge. If one person or both is not wearing a mask then they need to quarantine. After 7 days you can do test options and come back or wait the 10 days. Lunch time is the biggest group or athletic or other activities with out mask, still get quarantined. Anyone with close contact falls under quarantine guidelines. Only group that does not have test option and required 10 days if it is "in-house" exposure. These are big woo hoo life changing

changes. Matt Tranter and nurses are there to help test for those that want to participate in certain activities like sports. Change from 2 now to 4 tickets per person to allow more people to come to events. Our numbers got reset over Christmas break. At or above 1% for 2 consecutive days for us is 22 to be closed down. Are numbers higher or lower than they were in the fall? Currently Janilee thinks they are higher...maybe 18, includes faculty and staff. We have approximately 6-700 being tested every 2 weeks on a regular basis. All tests are being administered by the district nurses. Student nurses are an option offered by Tim to help get contact information. Starting this Friday vaccinations will get started.
