Every one of those days has at least one different activity people can do to donate to the chosen charity.

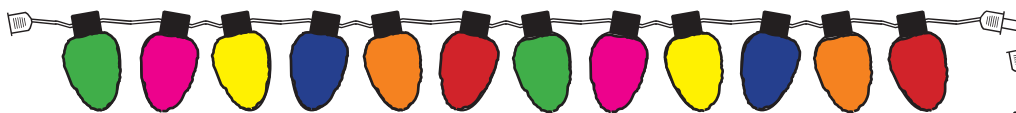
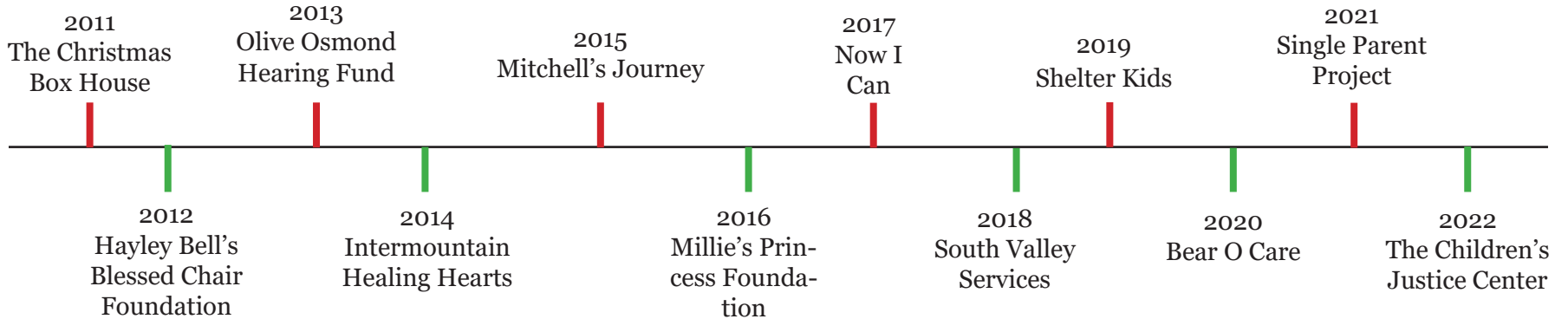
While we don't know the charity for this year yet, we will find out at the assembly on November 30th, the official kick-off of Silver Rush.
