

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# Upcoming AP Testing In May!

Art, history, English, math, science-Even art and ceramics. Many subjects such as these can also be taken as AP classes. All throughout the school year, the class time is spent on preparing you for the test that is taken sometime in May, up until the 17th.

Some of the tests consist of writing essays mostly that show what you've learned and can earn you college credit. Multiple choice questions are also a part of the testing arrangement.

Scores vary on the test you are taking and how well you do on the essay writing or the choices you make when answering questions. Scoring more than a 3 on average can offer you college credit giving you the advantage of saving money at the college or university you plan to go to and put your credits to.

Another advantage of taking the AP tests if you are enrolled in the classes is that you are able to stand out in college admissions, especially if you plan to go out of state.

Lessons and assignments you learn in class should help you better understand the topics that will be covered on the tests. Now two months of preparation are available to all students are taking the time to study, work hard, and memorize what will possibly be on the tests.

To know what days your test is, it is easier to go onto your AP College Board page and look when your test is scheduled. College Board also offers daily videos that cover the topics learned throughout the school year which is very helpful to have as a study guide. If that is not available then there are lots of other resources that should be able to help you such as Heimler on You-

Tube. He commonly covers the topics of World History, US History, European History, Human Geography, and AP Government.

So if you are taking these classes, there is a helpful person in addition to yur teacher. who will guide you through the testing process and the topics that are learned throughout the year. But your teacher is your best resource.
