Attendance

Consistent attendance is a critical component of academic progress, personal growth, and a positive learning environment. Excessive absences and tardies have a negative impact on learning and grades.

Excused absences: A parent or guardian must call or email the school within 5 days to excuse an absence. It is the student's responsibility to contact the teacher for missed information and work.

Tardy: A student not in the classroom when the bell rings is tardy.

Vacations: Students are responsible to notify the school of family vacations and fill out a vacation-release form.

No-Grade: Excessive tardies or absences can result in a "No Grade" (NG), that must be made up with time in attendance school during scheduled sessions.

Hall Passes: RHS uses the Securly hall pass manager. Follow teacher procedures for leaving class. School limits are no more than 3 hall passes per day, and students may not request to leave during the first and last 10 minutes of the class period. Violations may result in loss of hall pass privileges.

Service Animals

Jordan School District and RHS allow service animals to assist individuals, as required by law. Owners must keep their service animals under control and are entitled to access all areas open to students and staff. Non-owners should not touch, feed, or distract service animals, and must respect both the animal and its owner. Violating these rules can lead to school discipline and possible legal action.

Digital Citizenship & Cell-Phone Policy

Chromebooks: Students should be ready each class period with their charged JSD-assigned Chromebook.

Cell Phones: Per JSD Policy AA453, all personal electronic devices must be silenced and out of sight. Students requiring a medical exemption should speak to their administrator or counselor.

Unacceptable Use: Bullying, sharing inappropriate content, or misuse of digital tools—including unauthorized AI use—is not permitted and may result in loss of device privileges or other disciplinary action. Students are expected to care for school-issued Chromebooks; fees apply for damage or loss.

Plagiarism

Copying work from an online source, other published material, or another student and claiming it is your own work is plagiarizing. It is dishonest, illegal and stunts your learning. Don't do it. Plagiarized assignments will not receive credit.

AI Generated Work

In some instances AI will be used in the classroom to enhance the learning experience. Your teacher will clearly state when AI is appropriate and how to attribute AI text and images properly. Using AI of any type to complete assignments improperly will result in no credit.

Deadlines

Students are responsible for meeting grading and assignment deadlines. Teachers will communicate deadlines in advance. Teachers will remind students about upcoming deadlines, but it is each student's responsibility to keep track of due dates and manage their work accordingly. Plan ahead, communicate clearly, and respect your teacher's decisions regarding deadlines and late work. If students or parents have questions or concerns about a grade, assignment, or any class issue, they should first reach out directly to the teacher to resolve it.

For students with IEP or 504 accommodations, it is the responsibility of both the teacher and the student to communicate and work together to make sure accommodations are followed.
