



Digital Citizenship

Policy Overview

The goal of this policy is to help students learn how to engage responsibly with digital tools and minimize disruptions and distractions in the educational environment. As explained in JSD Student Conduct Policy (<u>AA419</u>) students are expected to use, possess, or care for any district/school owned electronic device or resource used for digital access, commerce, or communication in a safe, positive, courteous, and responsible manner in accordance with the standards established in JSD Student Information Network Acceptable Use Policy (<u>AA445</u>).

- Any use of an electronic device or resource, whether personal or district/school owned, that exploits personal
 information, disrupts the educational process, creates a hostile, threatening, humiliating, abusive environment
 (<u>AS98-Bullying, Cyberbullying and Hazing</u>), invades personal privacy or compromises the integrity of
 educational programs is strictly prohibited.
- 2. Sharing, using, or communicating pornographic images, "sexting", or other sexually suggestive materials, images, thoughts or phrases are strictly prohibited.
- 3. The possession, use, or care of any electronic device or resource is a privilege that may be forfeited if it causes a disruption to the learning environment.
- 4. At no time shall the District be responsible for preventing theft, loss or damage to personal electronic devices or resources brought to school or school sponsored activity.

Cell Phones/Electronic Devices

To begin class, students are expected to have their cell phones and all other personal electronic devices including personal tablets, gaming devices, headphones/earbuds, etc. to be silenced, not set to vibrate, and kept completely out of sight. Cell phones are not to be visible on desks during class time. **There are designated areas in the school where cell phone use is strictly prohibited such as restrooms, and locker rooms.** Cell phones and electronic devices can be a major distraction to the learning process for all students. Jordan District Policy Use of Personal Electronic and Communication Devices (AA453). To maintain a focused learning environment, students are expected to have their cell phone and other electronic devices (personal laptops, gaming devices, headphones/earbuds, tablets, smart watches, etc.) silent and put away at the start of class.

If a student violates the above policy, per Jordan School District Policy the following will occur:

- 1st Offense: Device is stored securely in the main office area for pick-up at the end of the day by the student.
- 2nd+ Offense: Device is placed in a secure container and stored in the Main Office for pick-up at the end of the day by parent/guardian. Please note that the Main Office closes at 3:00 PM so phones not picked up by that time will be securely kept overnight.
- Riverton High School may implement additional consequences if the student is not compliant with the policy.
