Special Education Students Our Special Education Team will consult with your current case managers to help select the appropriate courses that match your specific IEP requirements.	Multilingual Students Our ML Team and counselors will review WIDA test scores and progress to assist in selecting appropriate courses. WIDA testing takes place in February each year. Students needing additional English language support may have an additional English Language Development course added to their schedule.
Release Time (Seminary) This is a NON-CREDIT, off-campus religion class. Selecting Release Time (Seminary) will affect the number of total credits by 1.0 each year. Your total credits will show 7.0 credits instead of 8.0.	Concurrent Enrollment These COLLEGE-LEVEL courses count as BOTH high school AND college credit and will be on your future college transcript.
